

Explanation Notes:



1. Full legal name. Include Maiden name for married women.
2. Full postal address, including city and Zip Code.
3. Home telephone number. Work telephone number
4. Cellular telephone. Please indicate if it can receive texts (The diocese might use it to communicate with you)
5. Email Address. Is the fastest way for us to communicate with you and the diocese might use it to communicate with you, too.
6. Parish at which you are registered (or that you attend for Sunday Mass).
7. Day when you were born. Place where you were born.
8. Day when you were baptized. Name of the Church where you were baptized.
9. Full address of the Church where you were baptized.
10. Name of the priest or deacon that baptized you.
11. Your father's full name.
12. Your Mother's full maiden name.
13. Did you make your first communion? Yes or No. Did you make your first confession? Yes or No.
14. Are you legally married? Yes or No. Were you married in the Catholic Church? Yes or No.
15. If you are not married, are you cohabitating with your present boyfriend (girlfriend)? Yes or No.
16. What name have you chosen to be confirmed with. The candidate is invited to choose a new name for the Sacrament, which will be used by the Bishop when conferring the Sacrament on the candidate. The name will not change the legal name of the person. The new chosen name will be that of a Saint that the candidate admires in a particular way or for which you have a special devotion. You can choose to use your legal first name.
17. Name of the person that will be your sponsor at your Confirmation Mass. Canon 874 of Code of Canon Law lists the qualifications of the Confirmation Sponsor:
 1. Be appointed by the candidate, by the parents or by the parish priest; the appointed person must be suitable for this role and have the intention of fulfilling it;
 2. Be not less than sixteen years of age, unless a different age has been stipulated by the diocesan Bishop;
 3. Be a catholic who has been confirmed and has received the blessed Eucharist, and who lives a life of faith which befits the role to be undertaken;
 4. Not labor under a canonical penalty, whether imposed or declared (is not excommunicated);
 5. Not be either the father or the mother of the person to be confirmed.
